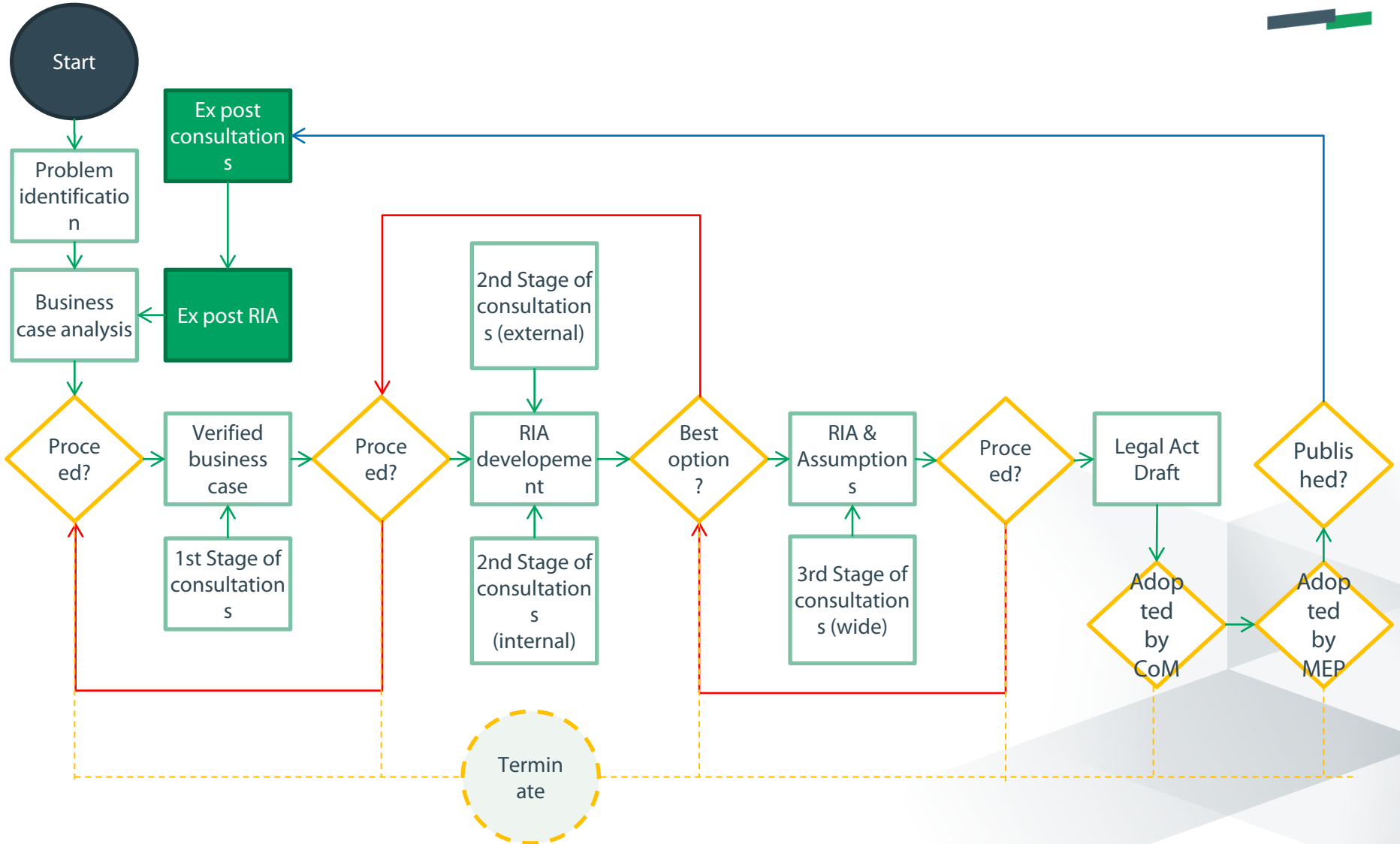

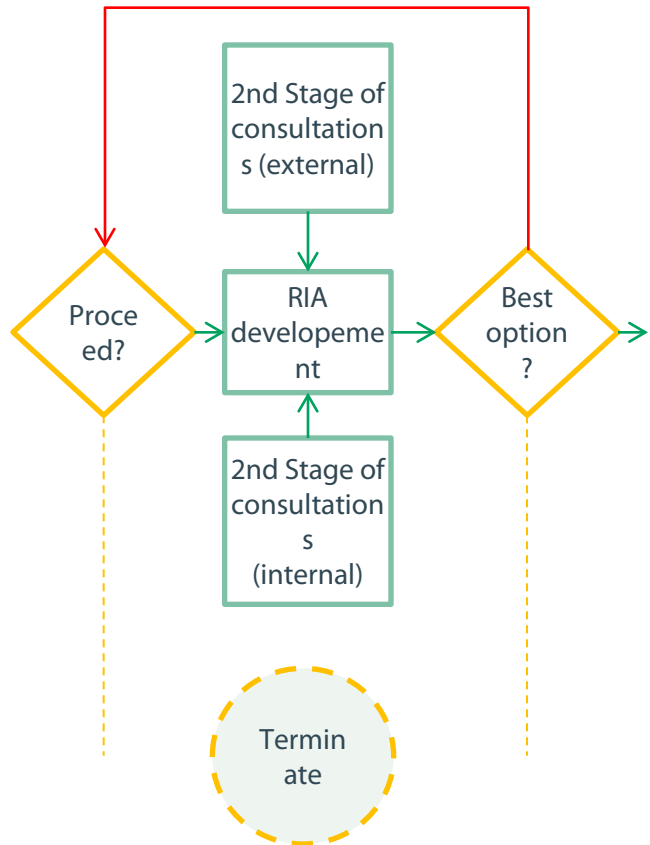
Key adopted documents

- Working Rules of Council of Ministers
- Guidelines for preparing Regulatory Impact Assessment
 - Adopted by Council of Ministers in October 2006 r. Author (MoE)
- Principles of consultation process carried out during the preparation of government documents
 - The document recommended for use by decision of the Council of Ministers of 30 July 2009 Author (MoE)
- Guidelines for Assumptions of government documents
 - Author Government Legislation Center
- Principles of Legislative Technique

Governmental Legislative Process – simplified

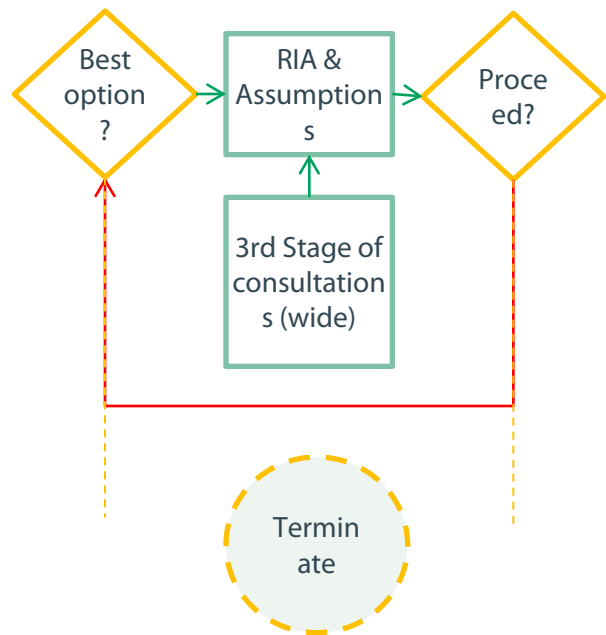


Impact assesment stage



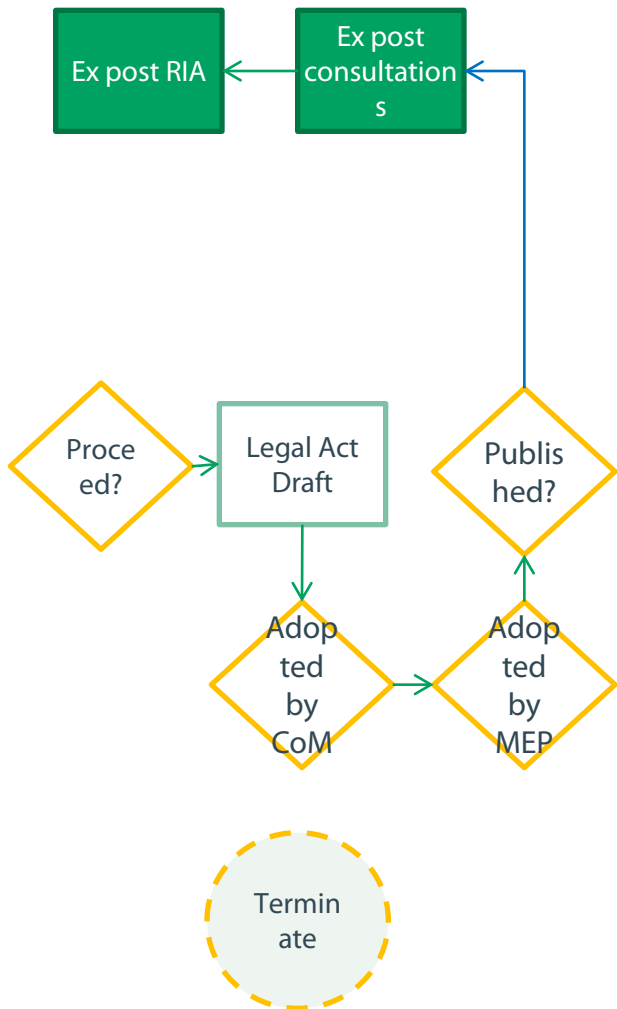
- Options comparision

- No consultation needed? (perfect world)
- Amendments?!



Ideal situation VS Reality

- Poor economic preparation for the introduction of draft laws
 - Lack of understanding of the idea of preparing guidelines and RIA
 - Low public awareness of the advisability of preparing RIA
 - None defined and economically reasonable Regulatory Objectives (SMART)
 - Lack of a strong will to develop evidence-based policy
 - No negative consequences of inaction (watch dog)
 - No studies also non-legislative options for solutions
 - Failure to respond to the documents consulted (0-Feedback)
- Legal poor preparation for the introduction of the bill
 - Often incomprehensible (for competence), RM Rules Regulations
 - No one (single) guidelines (4 documents)
 - Lack of standardization (process/project approach)

UK model

- Impact assessment
 - Extended economic analysis
 - Extensive public consultation - Call for Evidence
- The RIA
 - Economic tests
 - Projection time costs of the introduction of legislation
 - RIA undersigned by of decision maker!
 - Monitoring (ex-post)

Problem Analysis

- Investigated Problems
 - There are no dedicated tools available for legal act drafting.
 - There are no tools available for enforcing or supporting holistic approach for problem solving
- Upcomming Solution
 - Tool that enhances cooperation on legal act drafting in relations
 - Administration – Administration
 - Administration – End Users

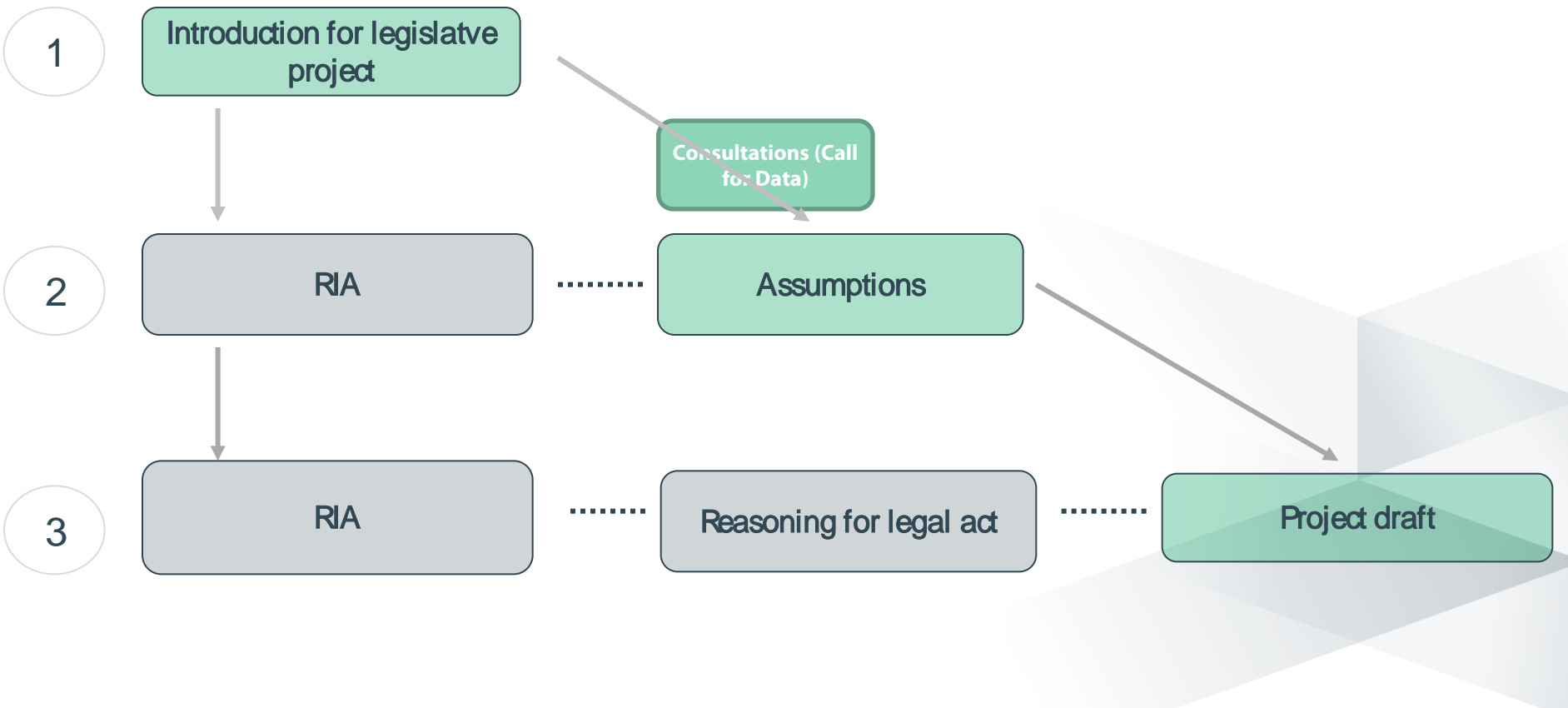

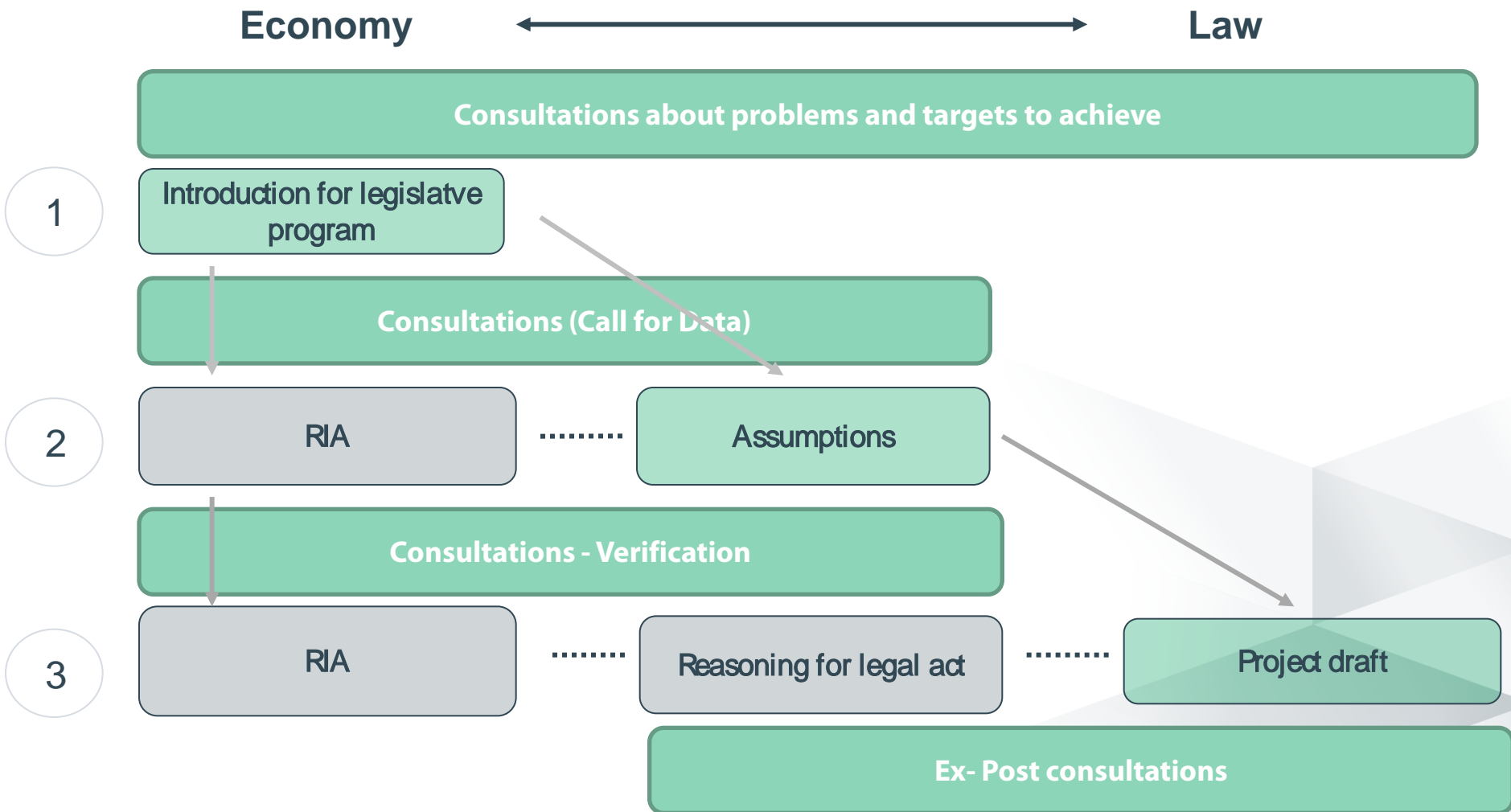
Document Matrix - Current

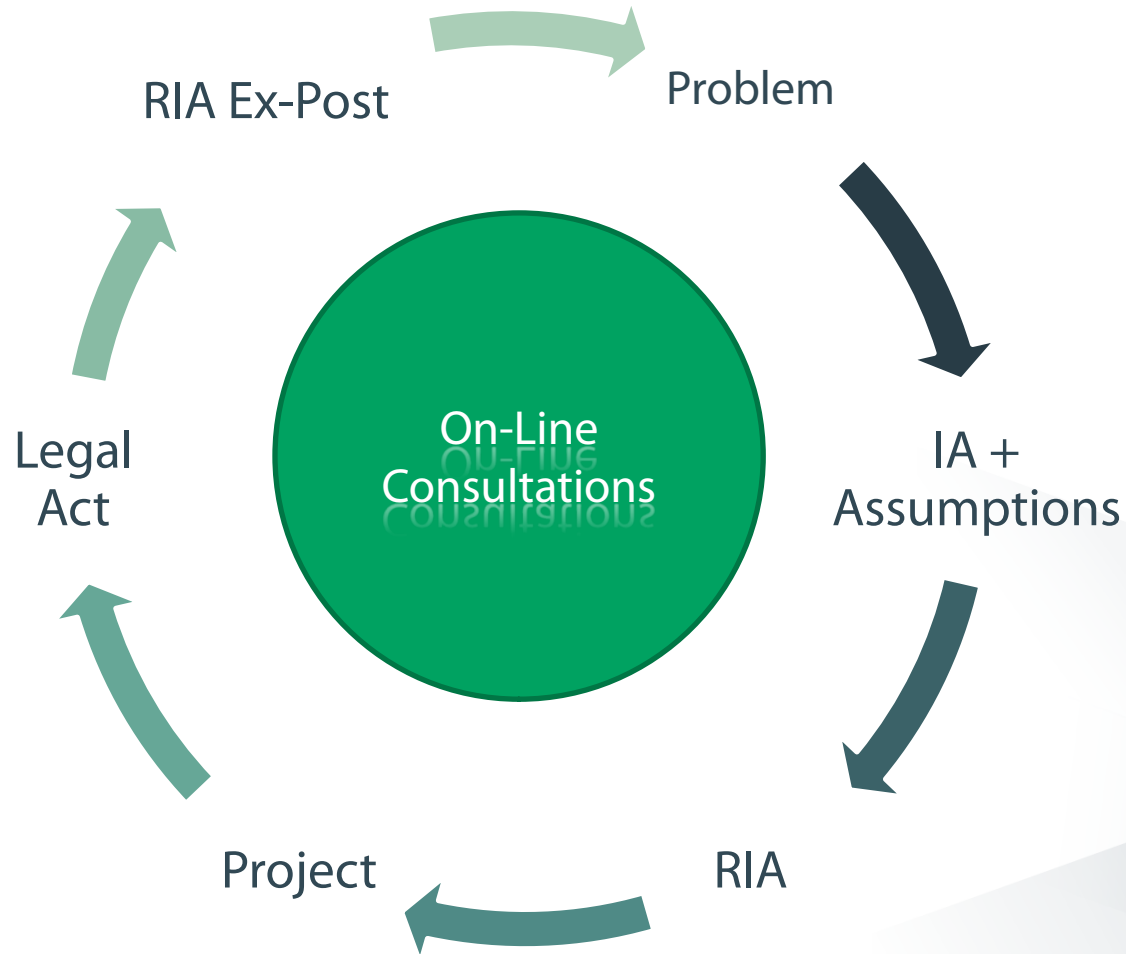


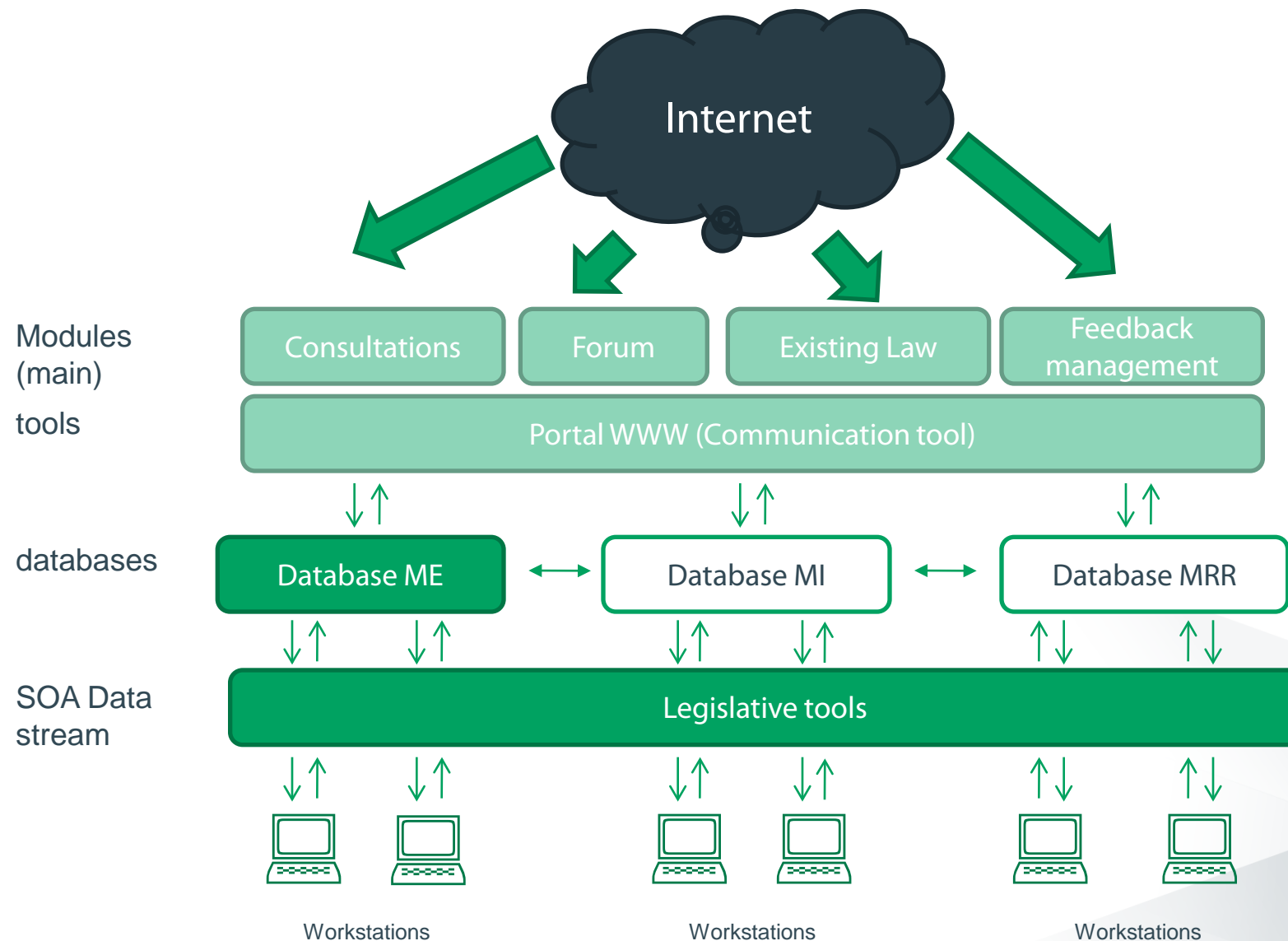
Document Matrix – After

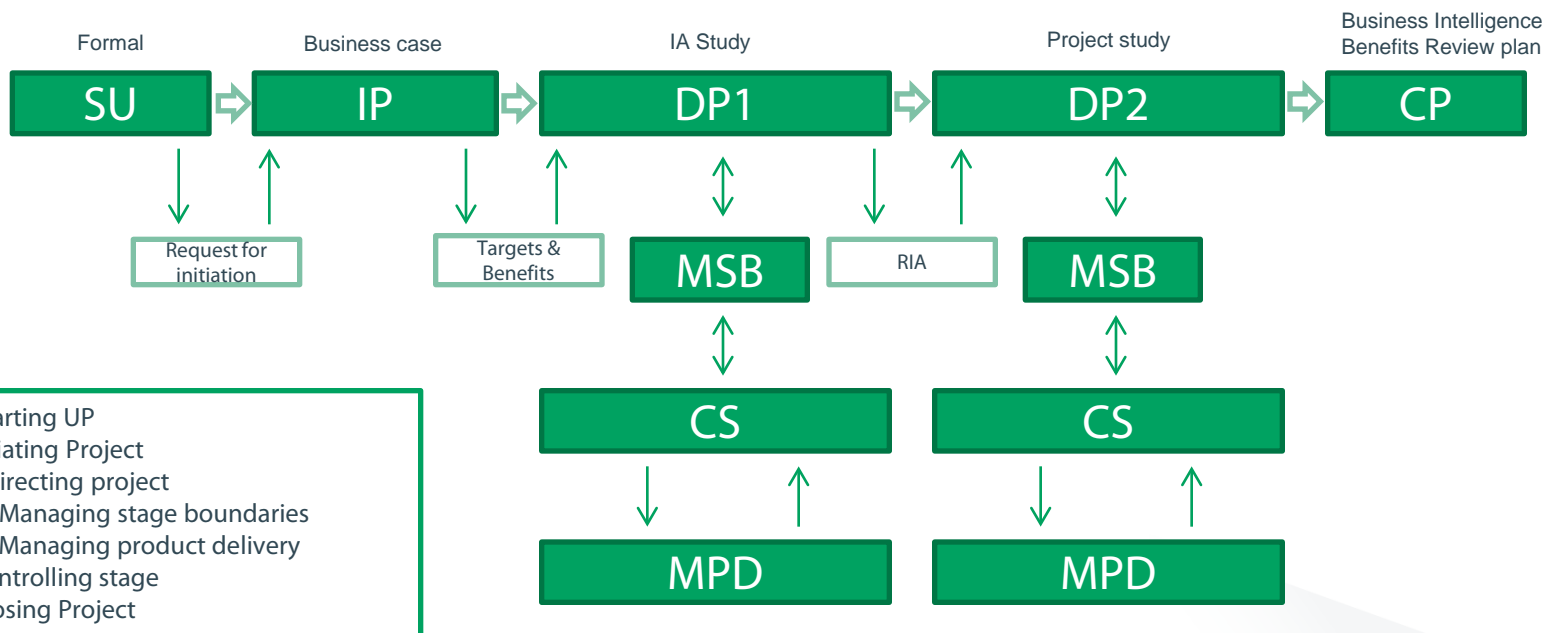

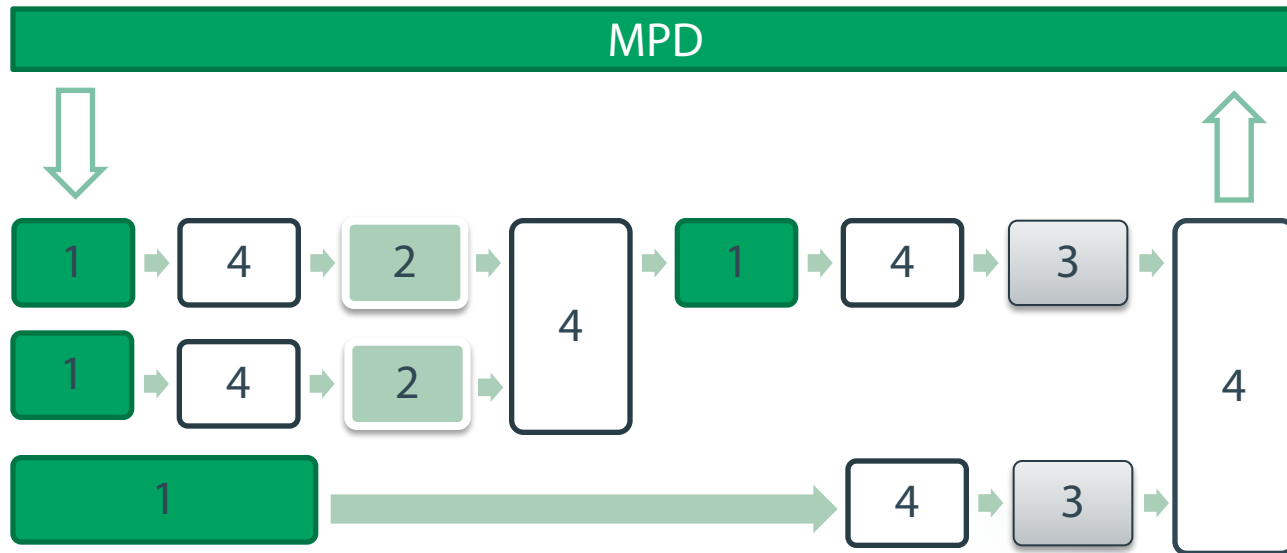
Legislative Project Template

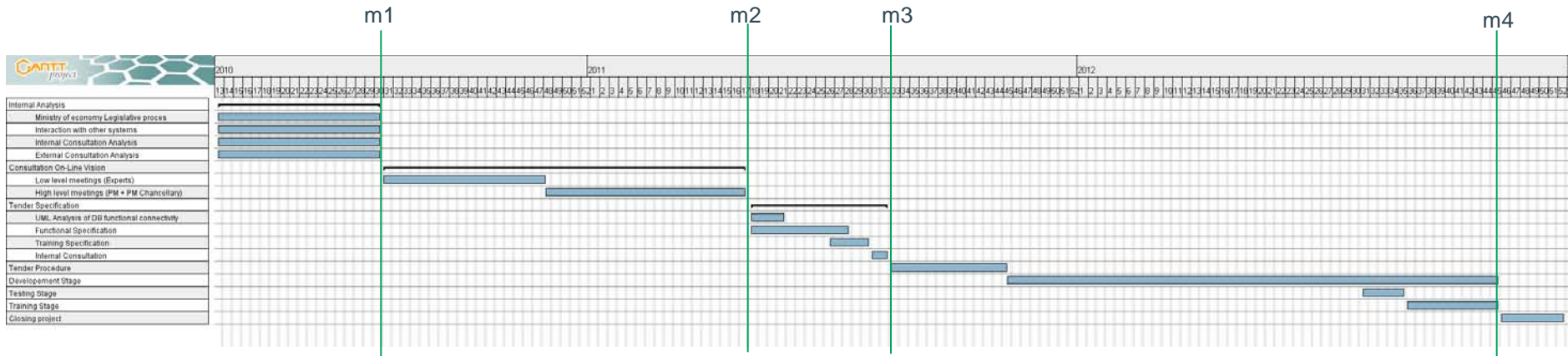
Managing product Delivery

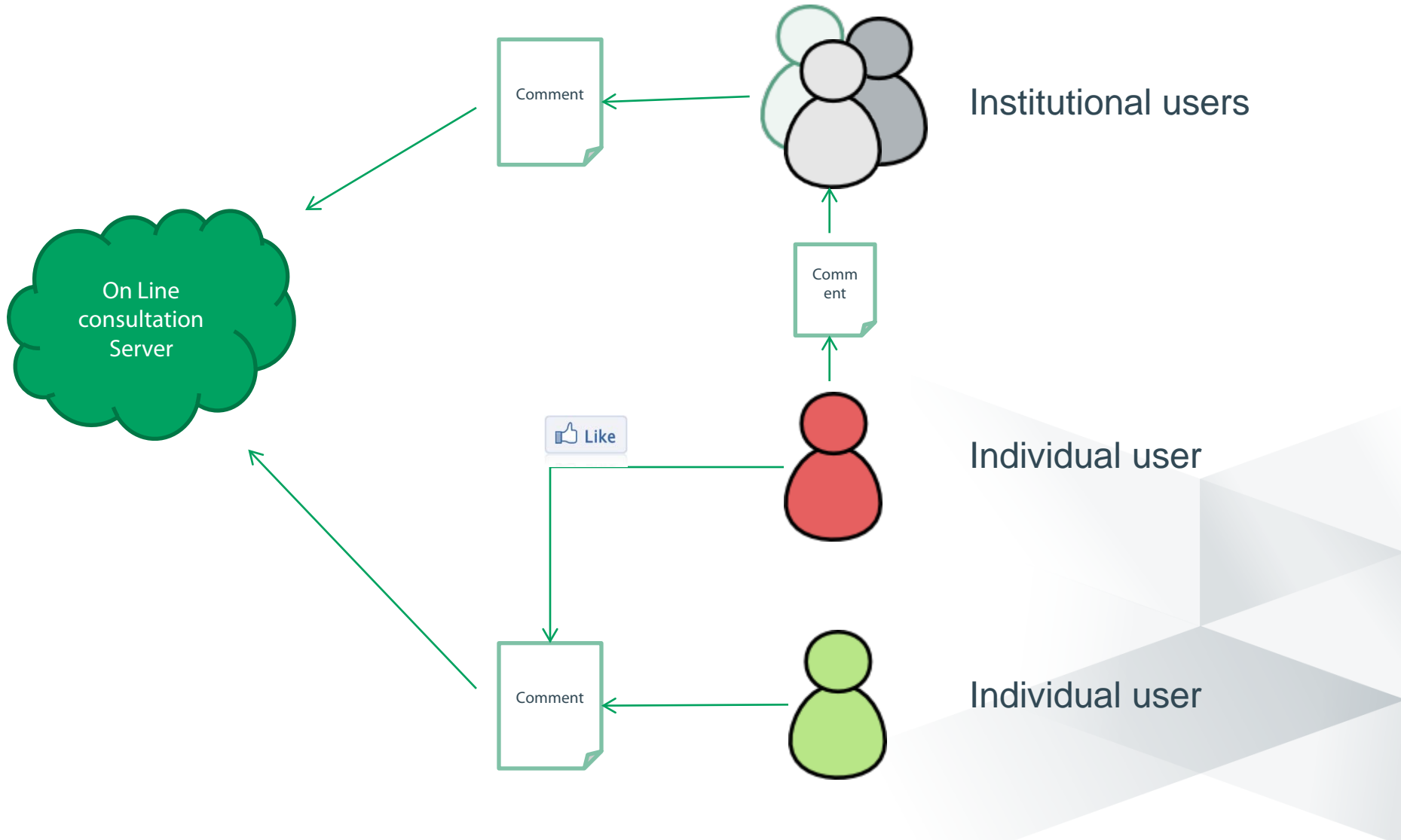
Project timeline

- m1) Internal analysis @ July 2010
- m2) External analysis and consultations @ May 2011
- m3) Functional Specification @ August 2011
- m4) Tender / end of planning process @ november 2011
- m5) End of developement @ November 2012

Expected Benefits I

- All legislation processes are mapped (even non-standard)
- Easy to evaluate as in Project environment (project folders of files)
- Enhancement in internal communication (NO SILO – Policy)
- Modular applications for enhancing evidence-base policy making
- Ease of external consultations (process support)
- Ease of control of external consultations (time and feedback ratio)
- Easy check for minimal document quality (transparency)

Expected Benefits II

- Easy to scale (whole system)
- Advanced data mining for resources from consultations (who said what)
- Ability for decrease in paper-type documents (Paperless policy)
- History of consultations and experts (consultants quality)
- Feedback (education of external consultants)
- Crowd-Sourcing implemented for problem solving
- Single Point of contact (everything in one place)
- Registration gives more possibilities (e-PUAP) (electronic platform for services)
